## Alanson "Lanse" Brown

Lanse started in field trials in 1965 – over 45 years ago – and has qualified 85 dogs for 53 National Championships, which includes being a National finalist twelve times. He has owned five dogs that were Double Header winners. Lanse was the founder of the South Jersey Retriever Club in 1969 and an officer in South Jersey Retriever Club, Shrewsbury River Retriever Club, Long Island Retriever Club, and the Montgomery Retriever Club.

Lanse made a major commitment to field trials through his judging and working at trials. He was a National Amateur Retriever Club judge in 1994, and worked at the National Amateur as a Marshal four times and six times on the Grounds Committee.

He continues to judge, with a total of 108 All-Age judging points and works at trials to teach new aficionados.

Lanse had great success with dogs in five decades, has handled dogs to 1301 All-Age points; and titled many dogs, including: FC-AFC Tigathoes Mainliners Mariah (Double Header winner and in the Retriever Hall Of Fame), Dual-CH-AFC Royal Oaks Jill of Burgundy (Double Header winner and in the Retriever Hall of Fame), FC-AFC Washington's Weeko (Double Header winner and in the Retriever Hall of Fame), AFC Winsome Cargo's Chaos, FC-AFC Trumarc's Aimee, AFC Louise V.B., FC-AFC Hi Cotton At Wit's End, FC-AFC Tailwind's Augie B, FC-AFC Eva Ethel Proby-Weber (Double Header winner), AFC Candlewood's She's So Fine and AFC World Famous Rosa Barks.

Lanse has made a lasting contribution to retriever field trials through his work and through the accomplishments of his dogs.
