

John Kemp Parrott



John Kemp Parrot attended his first field tiral in the fall of 1975. For 40 years and counting, he has been heavily involved in the retriever field trial sport. He has competed, worked, or judged in over one thousand trials.

John has owned 6 titled dogs as well as two National Field Champions. He won three Double Headers. In 1984, John won the National Retriever Championship with his dog NFC-AFC Wanapum's Lucyana Girl. He was a National Handler seventeen times and a Finalist three times.

At Nationals, John has chaired the Bird Throwers Committee and served on both Stewards and Marshals Committees. He judged both the 1990 National Amateur Championship and the 1992 National Open Championship. John currently serves as a Gun co-captain and has been a Gunner at the past thirty-seven Nationals.

John invented the first remote bird thrower, the Lucyana Strong Arm. He currently owns and maintains property in Louisiana and Wisconsin, where the 2013 (and upcoming 2017) NARC was held. The properties are open for training and field trials.

John still handles dogs, works at trials and occasionally judges. His lifelong commitment to "The Game" is to be admired.
